

The Transition Gradebook



Introduction & Purpose

- A database tool to track transition-related activities provided to individual students (Gr. 6 – 21 years old)
- Activities are based on the Predictors of Postschool Success and EWS is based on correlational research on dropout risk factors
- NTACT is funded by OSEP, so our products are free!
- The tool can record individual student's
 - Transition-related activities
 - Student involvement in IEP meeting
 - Skills training
 - Risk indicators and risk levels
 - Post-school outcomes



Uses for the Gradebook

- Supporting student-focused planning
- Keeping track of all activities the staff has delivered to each child
- Help identify students needing support or intervention in key areas
- Providing a summary of the Pre-ETS delivered
- Informing administrators about areas of risk and needs for additional program development



Some technical information

- Locally hosted web application (lives on a web server)
- Data and program reside at the school secure
- Access is administered by local IT staff
- No web server? Can use Heroku or Amazon Web Services' servers. Heroku is easier for setting up SSL security and can auto-update

- Student's ID number
- First name
- Last name
- Race
- Gender
- Grade / Age
- SpEd category (or leave blank)
- ELL status



Participation/Role in IEP Process

- Graduation Plan or Indiv. Learning Plan?
- Attended IEP Meeting
- Role in IEP Meeting
 - Attended
 - Introduced
 - Reviewed progress
 - Made suggestions
 - Led most of the meeting



Transition-related Activities

- Participation in transition-related activities:
 - Career Awareness Activities (e.g., job shadow)
 - Work Experience Activities (e.g., internship)
 - Inclusion (e.g., gen ed. core course, club)
 - Student Supports (e.g., mentor, tutors, etc.)
 - Collaborative Activities (e.g., family at IEP, referrals out)
 - Full list of activities



Whether student has Graduation Plan or other Individualized Learning Plan *and* whether they have received training in:

- Self-determination/Self-advocacy skills (Pre-ETS)
- Independent-living skills (Pre-ETS)
- Social skills (Pre-ETS)
- Travel skills



Risk Elements

- Percentage of school time absent (excused or unexcused)
- Number of behavior marks / office referrals this year
- Suspended this year
- GPA
- Failing English / ELA class
- Failing math class
- Failing other course(s)
- Off-track for grade level
- Retained one or more years
- Number of schools attended K present
- Participated in at least one extracurricular activity



Postschool Outcomes – one year out

- Student is engaged in
 - Postsecondary Education
 - Competitive Employment
 - Both
 - Other



Overview of Outputs

- **Dashboard** (opening screen) provides an interactive summary of all data in database
- Student-level reports
 - One time period
 - Multiple time periods
- Summary reports
 - One time period
 - Multiple time periods
 - Number of Student
 - Crosstab reports





Single student reports

- Single student overall report demographics, risk level, activities, risk factors, student skills
- All students option of single student report prints the above for every child (many pages!)
- Single student risk report one pager with only the demographics and risk/intervention info
- Single student's activities over <u>multiple periods</u>
- Single student's risk level, risk factors and intervention needs over multiple periods








Number of Students - by Activities | School Name | School Year 2017-2018, T2
